Hoover Post Office Kicks Off Monday, February 12th!

Hoover's annual school post office starts Monday, February 12th, and will run through Friday, February 23rd.

The Hoover Post Office is a great opportunity for students to use their writing skills and send postcards throughout the school.

Each classroom has a mailbox that students will use to send and receive their mail. 3rd grade students from Mrs. Babbel's, Mrs. Criscione's and Mrs. Perdue's classes will be our mail carriers and will pick-up and deliver the mail each day. Student Office Helpers (part of 5th grade leadership) will be the postmasters sorting the mail each day.

Parents and other family members are encouraged to drop by the table in the front lobby of the school to write a postcard to their child. All materials needed (postcards, school addresses, and stamps) will be at the table for your use.

- Write a letter to your child (all materials are available at the table in the lobby).

- Put a stamp on your letter (stamps and glue sticks are on the table for your use).
- Put your completed letter in the mailbox for our mail carriers to pick up.

Hearing Screenings

On Wednesday, February 7th, the Linn Benton Lincoln ESD Audiologists will be conducting <u>Hearing Screenings</u> on all Hoover Kinders, 1st, and 3rd graders.
